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Woodlands Primary Recovery Premium Plan 2022-23



Woodlands distributed their catch up allocation in line with the latest evidence in regards to impact. The Education Endowment Fund recently produced guidance which advised schools as to how best to allocate funding.

In summary, a 3-tiered approach was recommended:

- 1. Whole school strategies this focuses on an effective transition back into school and quality first teaching.
- 2. Targeted support this focuses on interventions and one to one strategies.
- 3. Wider strategies this focuses on support for parents, access to resources and additional programmes.

Whilst all children are targeted using Quality First Teaching, it was essential that we identified those with the most need. As a result, following the baseline results and teacher assessment data from July 2022, we held Pupil progress Meetings at the end of Term 1 2022 to further identify those children who had significantly fallen behind and needed additional support in order to catch up.

Having identified our priority children we decided to focus heavily on small group and 1 to 1 tuition (in phonics), Arithmetic in Maths and in KS2 Reading tuition to improve fluency, comprehension, vocabulary, stamina, and motivation. Studies demonstrate that well targeted small group and 1 to 1 tuition is likely to have the highest impact. As a rule of thumb, the smaller the group the better, so these tuition groups will consist of a small group of children identified as needing the most support.

This updated Catch-Up Provision plan includes a detailed use of Catch Up Funding and how the school is engaging with the National Tutoring Programme during the 2022-23 Academic Year. It should be read alongside the School Pupil Premium Strategy Statement but has been kept separate to ensure best use of funding for this important area of our provision.
