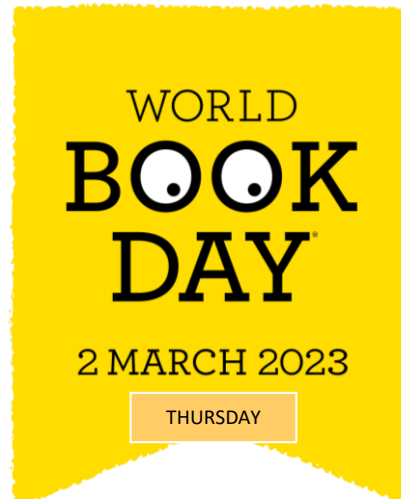


Wednesday 1st March 2023 – 4.30-5.00pm
